This Hotel has been under the cosh for a couple of years from the Local Authority. They want to demolish the Hotel to build a new Town Centre and Public Offices. All around has been flattened by the bulldozers but the Hotel up until now has been spared. The Hotel certainly hasn't had a lot spent on it these past years. It isn't five star quality and the outlook is a bit disappointing but it was comfortable and clean. We had to take a chance!!! Fortunately the management welcomed us, they of course wanted the business and a good deal was struck. **The rest is History.**

Lessons have been learnt and will be taken on board for any future bookings we make with Hotels or other Third Parties. The **Churchill Hotel** was a **Best Western Group Hotel**. When the chips were down, **Best Western** abandoned the Hotel and all it's customers. They claimed that all their Hotels are Privately Owned and **Best Western is just the Franchise Company**.

A big thank you also goes to Terry and Rita Kingsbury (Secretary of Snar Gate Lodge) for their friendship and help during the difficult times and of course to Stella and the **County Hotel**. Visit to Dover—UK

The Story of the Week as seen through the Secretary's eyes.

Wednesday For us the day started when we left Home on the Isle of Sheppey and made for Dover, a journey of little under an hour if we stick to the speed limit. Arriving at the County Hotel we were greeted by Stella our host for the duration of our stay. Stella who is the Functions Manager, put me at ease from the very start of our stay. She was more confident than I, that everything will go as we have planned. Joan and I



settled into our room and rested up a while before parking ourselves in the Lobby to greet all the Wednesday arrivals. The first through the Hotel doors was David Tabner and Joe Hart with their wives, closely followed by John Thomson and Arthur Corbett. No sooner had the first group checked in when the Scots arrived in the form of Alex and Liz Marr with Alex and Helen

Anderson. Albert and Wendy were next through the door. All the Wednesday arrivals were safely checked in. We all dined together in the Hotel Restaurant and had a few night-caps before retiring for an early night.

Thursday Today is the day, I thought to myself as we made our way down for breakfast. Its too late to change anything now. We have all morning to ourselves I doubt if anyone else will arrive before 12 o'clock so we have a little time to walk or in my case ride into town. After Joan had spent most of my money in town we returned to the Hotel where we learnt that a Volcano in far off Iceland had erupted.

He said that this was his first working Meeting since becoming Master of the Lodge and although he was pleased to see us and having a packed Temple is quite awe inspiring for your first Meeting, and it is also a very nerve racking experience. Never-the-less please enjoy your visit to Dover and your evening with us.

The work in the Temple this evening was to Raise Bro Madden The Brethren were treated to a very sincere and competent Ceremony of Raising. The work and ritual, by all the participating Brethren, was excellent. Indeed, <u>all</u> the work in the Temple by the Lodge Members was carried out in a very efficient and purposeful manor. The Deacons work was worthy of a special mention. Bro Steven Madden, the Candidate, will in due time, realise just how well and sincerely he was Raised.

As is **our** usual custom, the Lodge was presented with a cheque for £250, by our Speaker, **W.Bro Ian Benton**. Ian thanked the Lodge for their welcome to Dover and said they should use the money for what ever purpose they see fit. The Worshipful Master responded by thanking Ian and the EMA for there generous donation and said it will be put to good use.

The After proceedings and Festive Board were equally as enjoyable as the Meeting itself. The food and wine, which flowed quite freely, was excellent. The usual formalities were observed. The Speech to the visitors was given by W.Bro Roger Odd the Provincial Grand Secretary. He welcomed us on behalf of the Province and asked why we hadn't been to East Kent before. He proceeded to tell us a little about the Province of East Kent and the changes that are taken place. In extending a welcome to all the visitors and to the EMA in particular. He wished us a good stay in Dover and hoped we would visit this Province again. W.Bro David Tabner gave a light hearted response on behalf of the visitors and the EMA.

David thanked the Provincial Secretary for his kind words and welcome to this Province. David proceeded to tell a few stories, which met the approbation of the brethren (*made them laugh*). Several of our members had winning raffle tickets which lightly fuelled the evening. Our Masonic evening ended at about 10.30pm.

The Ladies were not forgotten or abandoned whilst we men folk were doing our thing. They were making merry in the Hotel, wining, dining and being thoroughly entertained by "Kurly" W.Bro Geoffrey Howells.

We all got back together for a night cap in the Hotel, for some it was straight to bed.

Friday. (Tour Day). Early breakfast for everyone. We're all on the Coach by 9.15 for the ride through the Kent country side and villages to the Ancient City of Canterbury. Ascending the hill to Dover Castle where, from the summit there is a commanding view of the Port and Town of Dover. We will return later today to the Castle. Taking the coastal road, which lays well back from the White Cliffs, we

meandered through the countryside passing picture postcard thatched cottages, by-passing ancient farmlands and hedge rows and 'olde worlde' rustic barns. Our journey takes us through several old villages where the centre of attraction seems now to be the Olde Coaching Inns which have been given new life by the brewery's. The hop strings awaiting the growth of the hops later in the year are in abundance around these small hamlets. They are all kept neat and tidy and are most welcoming to the visitor. We arrive at the seaside resort of Deal. A small fishing town with a very Victorian Pier. Apparently it was one of Queen Victoria's favourite seaside places. The Town with all the terrace housing and tiny shops is still very much lost in a Victorian time warp. Continuing on our journey through the outskirts of Canterbury we finally arrive back in the twenty first century with ultra modern office buildings soaring skywards mingling amongst the twentieth century housing. We finally arrive on the periphery road around the city. Modern offices on one side and the



ancient, three metre thick, city wall on the other. We must enter via the Pilgrims Gate to the Cathedral within the City wall.

Canterbury Cathedral, is a place of Pilgrimage, a place of Worship, a place for the Tourist, a place for the Archaeologists and for the real Masons and is the original first Church of England. The seat of the Head of the Church in England, the

Archbishop of Canterbury. The Archbishop does not live in Canterbury. He resides in his official residence at Lambeth Palace, just across the Thames from the Houses of Parliament. Right up to the Reformation Canterbury Cathedral was very much a Catholic Church under the direct influence of the Pope. Thomas Beckett was well involved in Politics and Religion a trite which cost him his life, but that's another story.

We were split into two groups for our Guided Tour of the Cathedral. I understand that one group were given far more information than the other on their tour. I personally found the tour very enjoyable and very informative, I learnt a lot, but as is the case on so many of these occasions we could have done with a little more time. I admit I was in the more informed group led by the Guide with the hair!!! On leaving the Cathedral we were set free to wander the narrow roads and alley ways of

the inner city. The city although Ancient it is a modern university City, very diverse and bubbly with a mixture of very olde worlde style houses and shops selling tourist tat and those up-market shops selling expensive merchandise..

To one side of the city and within the city wall there is a very modern Shopping Mall with all the leading retailers in situ. Running right through the centre of the city, every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday there is a street market. There you can buy everything from a Brussel sprout to a wardrobe. The market has a **Royal Charter** dating from ancient times. There have been many un-successful attempts to have the charter revoked by the City Council. Still the market remains and probably will do until the end of time.

Somewhere along Catherine Street in the middle of town there is a dingy looking building with a bright blue painted door adorned with a polished brass plate on which is engraved **Masonic Hall**. If you found this building and had entered, you would



have realised you are at the **Province of East Kent HQ.** Their Library and Museum are also here. It was closed on the day we visited Canterbury because it was the day of their Annual Festival in Margate.

We all boarded the Coach once again for the short drive back to Dover Castle. We were scheduled to visit the wartime caves and tunnels dug beneath the surface of the white cliffs. Some of these tunnels date from Napoleonic times. They may have been useful then and were certainly a blessing in those awful wartime years. Having trekked a route march through the Castle grounds, we finally arrived at the entrance to the Tunnels. Again we were split into two groups and advised to stick together in our groups and not to wander off. A clear indication that one could get lost in these tunnels. We were led through tunnels, caverns and caves that were fitted out as operational arenas, control rooms, telecom rooms and there were even living quarters and barrack rooms, a twelve bed hospital with an operating theatre and all the paraphernalia you associate with the same.

There were kitchens, pantries, power plants and generators, large rooms, small rooms and even little boys rooms (and little girls of course). Miles and miles of tunnels. We were shown the very <u>Control Room</u>, where our War time Generals directed the D– Day landings, and from where they also co-ordinated the Retreat from Dunkirk. All from beneath and within the White Cliffs. No one got lost or left in the tunnels! Once again time had beaten us, there just wasn't enough for a quick circuit of the Castle before making our weary way home. We did get a good view of the Channel and Port and we're told that on a good clear day, France can be seen. It was clearly an unclear day.

France is 22 miles 387 yards away from Dover at its nearest points.

To swim the Channel it is 21 miles 660 yards from "the point" at the harbour exit outside the sea wall. Subject to wind and tides. You must exit the water un-aided for any attempt to count. The swimmer must not touch the accompanying boat even to drink or feed. You must have an accompanying aid boat, when swimming, the boat should maintain a distance of 25yds from the swimmer. A record is kept of every attempt, failure or success, to swim the Channel. The quickest crossing is 5 hours and 42mns by Simon Mayes (American). (He must have been wearing flippers). The slowest recorded is 27hrs and 19mins by an anonymous French male.

Forty four weary souls arrived back at the Hotel. Time is on our side now, we have just an hour before we all dine together in the Restaurant. The usual facilities remained open at the hotel until we all Retired for the night.

<u>Saturday.</u> Breakfast as usual this morning although one or two had a lie in. After breakfast the brethren moved into the Ward Room for our

Annual General Meeting. (Full Minutes are included in this Newsletter). Most of our Ladies had a happy saunter around the Precinct and Shopping Mall before returning to join the Brethren for a Buffet Lunch in the Hotel. The whole afternoon was at leisure.

All dressed in our finest garb we assembled in the lounge at 6.15pm. We were met by some old friends, in particular Tom and Sandra Fenny and many new friends especially those from the Snar Gate Lodge with their ladies for a Champagne Reception prior to our Gala Dinner. Chef's vegetable Soup was followed by Lemon Champagne Sorbet, to clear the pallet. Just time for one small aperitif before indulging in the excellent Carvery with a choice of meats to choose from, or as most did a little of each. The Sweet, if you still had room, was Black Forest Gateau and Cream. Wine was served throughout Dinner. Our DJ, Clive made sure



that suitable and appropriate Music was played during dinner which helped create the atmosphere for a truly great Gala Dinner. After dinner, Clive set the pace with some good dancing music and the dance floor soon overflowed with people enjoying themselves. It was very pleasing



to Joan and myself that all was going so well with everyone putting their troubles behind them, if only for one night. The dancing gave way to 'Kurly' for a short Cabaret with some of his favourite songs from the '70s and '80s. I think we were all suitably entertained. Minutes of the Forty Second Meeting of the EMA held at The County Hotel Dover UK.

AGM Agenda.

There were present **Bro Ian Benton Speaker**, **Bro David Tabner** Assistant Speaker, **Wil de Clercq** Assistant Speaker, **David Parkhill** Treasurer, **Gordon Reeves** Secretary and twenty four other Brethren, all of whose names appear in the Attendance Book.

The Quaich was circulated and the Brethren partook of the Golden nectar sharing True Brotherly Love.

Item 1) Opening

The Meeting was opened at 10.40am by Bro Ian Benton our Speaker. He welcomed all the Brethren to Dover adding he hoped our gathering will be a memorable visit.

Item 2) The Minutes of the Forty First Meeting The Minutes of the European Masonic Association Meeting held on Saturday 17th October last at The Tamisa Golf Hotel Malaga Spain having been circulated vide The Newsletter were accepted as a true record and confirmed by the Brethren that were present. Proposed by W.Bro Suresh Gupta and seconded by W. Bro Brian Lowings, that the Minutes as recorded be accepted. They were signed by the Speaker Ian Benton.

Item 3) Matters Arising.

This of course will be cancelled out in next years balance when Gordon has cleared his arrangements with the Hotel. This will be under next years accounts.

Item 5 The Auditors Report.

Item 6) Creditors Report.

Bro Gordon Reeves, the Secretary gave a brief report on the Churchill Hotel that was originally booked for this weekend. A £500 Deposit was paid before the Hotel went into administration. He said that the chances look a bit grim for us to get all our money back but we have Registered with the Administrators as a Creditor. We have been accepted as true Creditors and may get something back in due course. The financial position of the Hotel Owners was not good. The Company have very little left to pay off Creditors after all the Administrators Fees and the like are taken off. Probably 10p in the pound, if we're lucky.

Item 7) To Ratify New Members.

W. Bro David Tabner responded by saying he was asked to Reply for the Visitors several days before the meeting. He said he was asked in effect to tell a few stories, which is what he did. He said he didn't think he was vulgar and certainly didn't think he had offended anyone. If he had he was sorry and would apologise to all who felt offended. The Secretary said, He was sorry this matter had been raised but he had asked David to respond for the Visitors and had asked him to tell a few stories which was the request from the Lodge Secretary.
